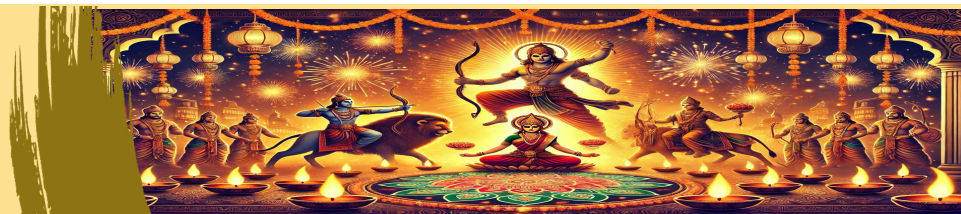

11. School building perhaps most attractive in Gujarat State, classes and playgrounds spread over sprawling areas with trees, grass and lush-green lawns in the campus.
12. Well qualified, trained and experienced teaching, non-teaching and supporting staff are working day and night for the school and its development.
13. Constant interaction with parents through SMS, POPs and PTMs.
14. **Vacation Assignment**
The teachers will give home assignment to the students before Summer and Diwali vacations. The students must finish the task during their vacations and also prepare themselves fully for examinations, which commence soon after re-opening.
15. **Homework**
The school believes strongly in the value of appropriate and relevant after hours school work at all levels. Such activity is a valuable reinforcement of classroom teaching and helps in the development of self-motivation and self-discipline. However, the school bears in mind that to develop the mind, spirit and being of our students they require time after school to attend to

family matters and pursue their many non-academic interests. To this end, the school will ensure that any "out-of-class" work that is issued is necessary and relevant.

It is important that parents communicate with the school if home assignment is incomplete or taking students longer than sensible. The school understands that there will be times when a student is unable to complete homework. If a child cannot complete homework for any reason, parents are asked to send a letter of explanation with their child to the teacher. A message in the diary is sufficient.

16. Block Period Concept

We always try to find ways of making our school more and more student friendly. So to ensure the comforts of the young learners, school has taken initiative to reduce the burden of bag by allotting block periods up to class V. Students are not required to bring all the books to school daily. Hence parents are requested to send the books strictly as per the class timetable for the day.

17. Tours and Excursions

We at Bhagwati International Public School realize that learning cannot be confined to the four walls of classroom but goes far beyond that. So picnics, field trips and industrial visits form an integral part of teaching learning process at BIPS, a good number of exposure trips, picnics and excursions will be organized based on the demand of the classroom transactions and when required to equip the learners with first-hand experience of the place. Dates and venues for the same will be communicated to the parents beforehand.

18. Inter-House and Skill Oriented Activities

There are four Houses in the school - Red, Blue, Green and Yellow. Every student of class I onwards is placed in one of these Houses.

A student designated as House Captain heads each House. A teacher, assisted by House Tutors, acts as the House Warden. Points are awarded to the students throughout the year for their performance in curricular and co-curricular activities. Points are also awarded to individual students and groups for their performance in competitions.

Inter-House competitions are organised and trophies are awarded to Houses for their performance in literary, cultural and sports activities. Every outstanding student is given a certificate for his / her performance in these competitions.

SCHOOL RULES & REGULATION

1. Admissions

We admit students from vernacular background and bring them to the level of **English Medium Public School** within a short span of time which rarely any schools in India can do. Actually, it

helps in eliminating inherent constraints in remote areas which is rarely found in other schools in India.

2. School Uniform Rules

- Students must wear their uniforms with pride and ensure that they look neat and presentable at all times. I-Card is an integral part of school's uniform.
- A student must always come to school in uniform, also during the practical and special classes.
- No student is allowed to attend any Open House, school function in or outside the school in any dress other than school uniform.
- It is mandatory for girls to wear Blue Slacks under their skirts/tunics.
- **Students not in complete/neat uniform can be debarred from boarding the bus/entering the school.**
- Boys are required to wear shirts and pants as per the design specifications of the prescribed uniform.
- Non-Compliance of rules given above will not be tolerated at any cost and repeated offence will result in suspension for a week.

3. Bullying and Harassment

Bullying / harassment is an illegitimate use of power, we ensure that our learners are free from the clutches of any sort of harassment or bullying. Such illegitimate behaviour could include repeated, systematic, isolated, infrequent, episodic, or continuous behaviours. Bullying / harassment is a behaviour that may take various forms.

- **School has a policy that endeavours to**
- reduce all instances of bullying / harassment;
- give students the confidence to report bullying / harassment behaviour if it arises;
- empower students to provide assistance to the victims of bullying / harassment;
- encourage students to see bullying / harassment as something they need to view as part of their responsibility even if they are not directly involved;

4. Late Arrival in School

- Students are expected to reach school 10 minutes before the start of the school.
- Ideal Bhagwatians are expected to report at least 5 minutes before the stipulated time.
- School gate will close 5 minutes after the school timing.
- Students arriving late will not be allowed to enter the school premises.
- Arriving late for school is not acceptable. Students found to have come late for more than two days in a term will not be allowed to attend classes on third such occurrence and disciplinary action shall be taken against them.

5. Library Rules

The School Library is open for the students during the school hours on weekdays. At least one library period is assigned in the weekly schedule for each class. Students have to observe the following rules:

- They must carry their Almanac to the library.
- Students are not allowed to bring their personal books into the library.
- They must maintain silence in the library.
- Books issued should be returned to the library in a good condition. If a book is marked, disfigured, lost or damaged, the borrower will have to either replace the book with its new edition or pay double the recent price of the book.
- Students can borrow books on their own cards only. Reference books will not be issued to students.

- Books are issued for 7 days and periodicals for 2 days. A fine of Re 1:00 per book per day and Rs 2.00 per periodical per day is charged for returning books/periodicals after the due date. In case of books returned after 15 days of the issue date Rs 2.00 per book per day will be charged and periodicals returned after 4 days of the issue date Rs. 3.00 per periodical per day will be charged.

6. **Laboratory Rules**

- In the laboratory, students must abide by instructions given by the teacher. To avoid any laboratory accident, student must follow the safety rules and all the instructions of Lab In Charge and Lab Manual.
- Students will be responsible for any breakage or loss of apparatus.
- Every breakage or loss should be reported immediately to the Principal and the student should deposit its cost.

7. **Absence and Leave Taking Policy**

- Students are responsible for making up all work missed during the period of their absence.
- In exceptional medical cases, parents may take their wards home during school hours. For this, they must give a written application to the principal stating clearly the reason for taking their wards out of the school. Permission to go during school hours for marriage, puja, outing etc. will not be entertained. However, the student will be marked absent for the day.**
- No student who was absent on the previous day will be admitted to the class without the permission of the Home Room Teacher.
- In case a child remains absent for three consecutive days without prior permission after a long vacation or in the beginning of the session, his/her name will be struck off the school rolls. For rest of the session, absence for six consecutive days, without prior permission, will lead to the name of the child being struck off the rolls. Re-admission will be purely at the discretion of the Principal and that too, with full admission fee.
- Those absent without granted leave would be fined at the rate of Rs.5/- per day. If, on any day, the attendance of a particular class becomes less than 85%, all students remaining absent on that day shall be charged a special fine as decided by the school. The students already on sanctioned leave would be exempted from this fine. Those absent because of sickness must present the medical certificate on or before they rejoin the school.
- A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate of fitness to attend classes.** Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the period of quarantine before returning to class:
a) Chicken pox b) Measles c) Mumps d) Whooping Cough e) Conjunctivitis f) Corona.
- No re-examination or re-test will be held in any case for the students who remain absent in any of the examinations / tests. Similarly, no test or exam schedule shall be changed to suit individual needs.**
- School strongly discourages and strictly prohibits the wrong practice of taking child home for half period, half day or to skip any class or to take him/her home after the completion of the school exam under any reiterate reasons.

8. **Withdrawal and Disciplinary Policy**

We, at BIPS believe in discipline and firmness. Slackness, disobedience and disregard of rules will not be tolerated and any work or action likely to lower the image of the school is regarded as a breach of the school discipline.

The school reserves the right to expel students whose diligence or progress in studies is considered unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students. Immorality,

insubordination or contempt of authority and breaking bounds are always sufficient reasons for being expelled or rusticated immediately.

- The Principal reserves the right to ask for the withdrawal of any student who has proved immune to correction and is highly undisciplined or is medically declared unfit to pursue his/her normal studies in the school.
- Application for Transfer Certificate shall be made in writing to the Principal by the parents of the child. The school authorities cannot issue transfer Certificate once issued again. If lost, only duplicate can be obtained from the school on the following conditions:
 - a. Application to be made in writing, giving reasons along with an affidavit.
 - b. Application must be signed by the student and countersigned by the parent or guardian.
 - c. The duplicate certificate can only be issued after 7 days of the receipt of the application.
 - d. At the time of taking the Transfer Certificate, all dues to the school must be paid in full for the period during which the pupil's name was in the School Register.
- **In the case of students who want to take admission elsewhere after the completion of the session, parents must apply for Transfer Certificate (TC) between the 1st February to 10th March or else the school fees for the 1st quarter has to be paid in full.**
- Fees paid for a quarter shall not be refunded.
- Transfer or withdrawal certificate will not be issued until all dues of the school are settled.
- A student shall be suspended or expelled from the school on the following grounds:
 - a. Gross indiscipline.
 - b. Non-payment of dues.
 - c. Detention or repeated detention in the same class or gross poor academic performance beyond the remedial control or support of the school.
 - d. If the authorities are convinced that such a withdrawal is necessary in the interest of the school.
 - e. The name of the student will be struck off the rolls after continuous absence without information for fifteen days or more.
 - f. He/She may be readmitted as per the rules and the discretion of the Principal.
- Every student must have at least 75% (Pre-Primary Classes) / 80 % (Classes I to V) / 85% (Classes VI onwards) / 85% IX and XI attendance to get promotion to the next class. The school management decision regarding the same will be abided to all the applicable cases and will be considered final.
 - a. Those who fail to fulfill this criterion will either be debarred from appearing at an examination and marked zero for the same in the mark sheet or shall be detained in the same class.
 - b. The attendance percentage criterion is applicable to each of the two terms separately. Benefit of having more attendance for Term I will not be given to the Term II.
 - c. The relaxation in the attendance may be granted subject to the full satisfaction of the Principal on any of the following two grounds:
- **Medical grounds**
In case the child is seriously sick and remains absent for two or more than two consecutive working days he/she will have to produce the medical certificate from a competent authority.
- Any mishappening in the family : In case there is any untoward incident in the family.
- Irregular attendance, non-submission of leave application, insubordination to teachers, any kind of cheating or serious misconduct or any habit or behaviour objectionable to the good name of the school are sufficient reasons for punishment, even dismissal from school.

- A child failing twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his / her studies in the school especially if he / she becomes overage for that class. As a rule only those students will be retained on the roll of the school that can take the school leaving examination under 18 years of age.
- The Decision of the Principal shall be final and binding in this regard.

9. Payment of Fee

In connection of the payment of the fee, parents are requested to note the following:

- Fee is to be deposited cash or A/c Payee cheque drawn on any local bank favouring "Bhagwati International Public School" as per the school policy of the payment of fee to the Bank decided by the School Management.
- No outstation cheques are acceptable. In case of a dishonoured cheque, due to any reason, a fine of Rs.100/- will be charged.
- Fee once paid shall not be refundable under any circumstance.
- It is the moral obligation of the parent to pay the school fee regularly and on time as per school fee schedule and policy and school sincerely appreciates your humble and timely cooperation and punctuality.
- In case the fee is not deposited within the mentioned deadline, a late fee of Rs. 100/- per week is added till the end of the month concerned after which the name of the child shall be struck off the School Register.

10. Rules for Lunch & Food Stuff

As it is said, "A healthy mind lives in a healthy body", one of the important responsibilities of the school is to promote healthy eating habits among the young students. Keeping the health and fitness of all the students in mind, school discourages the use of packaged food & other edible stuffs in the school premises like, chips, wafers, noodles, chocolates, fried stuff, etc.

The menu advised to be followed by the students:

Roti -vegetable, Dal-Rice, Paratha- Vegetable, Curd-Rice, Pulao- Curd, Masala Khichari, Upma, Batata- Poha, Stuffed Paratha, Thepla, Dhokala, Idli, Sprouts, Boiled Sprouts, Seasonal Fruits & nuts.

PARENTS-SCHOOL INTERACTION

1. Parents Interaction

True education seeks a continuum between the efforts made by the child, the parents and the school. Every time a child discovers a truth about the self or when they accomplish a milestone, a foundation is laid for the building of yet another discovery or creation. The work of parenting and teaching is to identify these moments and to provide space and encouragement for children to build upon their inherent strengths.

Since the experiences of the school and the home are equally significant for the development of all children, BIPS encourages harmonious interaction in thinking and approach between the parents at home and teachers in school. Thus, the school will continuously work to establish open channels of communication between home and school. From time to time, the school will organize a range of opportunities and activities for parents to interact with resource persons, teachers and school counselor. The overall purpose is to enable positive collaborative efforts to build on the child's strengths. Workshops, open parent interactive sessions and one-on-one parent teacher meetings provide ample scope for the respective caretakers to bring their best efforts forward for the development of the child. The school welcomes constructive suggestions and ideas from all parents to make their children's development more meaningful and real.

2. Partnership Between Home and School

A supportive relationship between the school and the home is vital to ensure the successful education of each child. Parents are asked to work with the school by:

- ensuring their children abide by the school rules;
- actively participating in the life of the school;
- communicating effectively and positively with the school, including following the school's guidelines and ensuring the communication of any concerns occurs in an appropriate manner;
- supporting the work of the teachers;
- becoming familiar with the school's procedures, processes and events by reading the relevant material, particularly the circulars sent;
- knowing their child's homework expectations and providing an appropriate environment for homework to be done; not completing a child's work for him / her; and,
- ensuring attendance at school each day.

- You are requested to co-operate with the school in its attempt to help your ward's progress by paying attention to his/her regularity, punctuality and discipline and by taking interest in his/her homework.
- You are requested to check the Almanac everyday and note the homework and other instructions in it. In case of small children, the parents are advised to check the bag of their wards to see if any notice / invitation has been issued.
- **You are welcome to visit the Principal on Saturday between 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Other than Saturday, prior permission is required through telephonic consent. The teachers may be consulted on Wednesdays and Saturdays between 1:30 pm to 2:00 p.m. during Summer Schedule and 2:00 p.m to 2:30 p.m. during Winter Schedule. Emergency is always addressed with priority.**
- You are requested not to enter the academic area to speak to your ward or a teacher.
- You are requested to examine the progress report carefully and see that your ward makes special efforts to improve in the deficient subjects.
- **No amount of private tuition can substitute classroom teaching.** If a student is attentive and regular in his/her duties, there may not be any need for private tuition. Private tuition generally reduces self-confidence, initiative of the student and time for self-study.
- Slow learners may take full advantage of acceleration classes, which are arranged by the school. Similarly, all proficient students should attend the special classes to improve their performance.
- Rules regarding uniforms with respect to cleanliness must be observed strictly throughout the academic year. The rule holds good for shoes and socks also.
- Any communication made by parents / guardians should be addressed to the Principal and not to the Home Room Teacher (Class Teacher) and all correspondence from the school to the parents must be through the Principal.
- Prompt acknowledgement will be appreciated when a warning note or circular is sent to you. Any information regarding the child should be conveyed to the authorities through school diary.
- You are requested to pick you ward from the school as soon as it gets over. The school authorities will not be responsible for the custody of the child after school hours.
- You are requested to see that your child abides by the rules of the school. In case of violation, disciplinary action will be taken.

- Any damage done to the school property will be made good by the student concerned, together with a fine imposed for such an offence.
- Criticism of the teacher or school in the presence of children should be scrupulously avoided because it causes them to lose respect for their teachers with the consequent failure to learn from them. It further retards his / her progress.
- No student will be exempted from physical exercise and games without a doctor's certificate and prior approval of the school authorities.
- It is not advisable to give the children valuable articles like expensive watches, fountain pens, fancy stationery, mobile phones, i-pods, calculators and jewellery etc. to bring to school. In case of any loss of valuables or other articles, the school authorities will try their best to trace these but shall not undertake any responsibility for the loss.
- All students are expected to join the school on the notified date at the beginning of the school term. A fine of Rs. 10 /- will be imposed for absence on the reopening date, unless the Principal is informed before the beginning of the term and satisfied about the reason.
- Students will not leave before the end of the term, which officially ends after the flag assembly on the last day. Parents and guardians will appreciate that absence during term is not in the best interest of the student.
- Leave may be granted to your ward only on the following grounds:
 - a. In case of serious illness or death of a very near relative.
 - b. For the condolence visits if the student is the only male member of the family and his presence is essential according to the custom.
 - c. To attend the marriage of his / her own brother, sister or brother / sister of either parent.
 - d. To perform the tika ceremony of his sister if he is the eldest brother in the family.
- Permission to write only the test/ assessment and remain absent for the rest of time will not be granted.
- You are required to inform the school if there is any change in address or telephone numbers or mobile numbers.
- Children, when sick, should not be sent to school to attend tests / classes.
- You are requested to encourage your children to speak in English.

5. Visiting Hours

The school would like parents to maintain a close rapport with the teachers and meet the Principal or teachers. Parent-Teacher Meeting dates are mentioned in the almanac.

In case you wish to communicate with the teachers, you are requested to use the 'Parent's Remarks' pages given in the Almanac so that we are able to address your requests/queries satisfactorily. You may also meet the teachers by prior appointment in school as per the timings mentioned in the almanac.

However, you are requested not to call up the school reception with a request to the teacher to attend to you on telephone during school hours (except in case of emergency) as this disrupts the routine of the school.

Parents are strongly encouraged to meet the teachers on the specified days only. This is to avoid disappointment arising from teachers being engaged in the class. Parents are requested not to go directly to the class to meet the teachers.

For taking appointment with the Principal, please call the school or write in your child's almanac. The teacher will then communicate giving the date and time of appointment. Please do abide by the day and time allotted for a meeting.

EXAMINATION

A student absent from any of the examinations without valid reason and without prior permission will not be considered for promotion to the next higher class. Even if absent with prior permission, no re-examination will be conducted. Students who represent the school for some competition or

programme with the permission of the Principal may be exempted. Minimum marks for promotion to the next class will be 33% in each subject.

1. General Promotion Rules

- Students passing in all the subjects securing minimum 33% marks in each subject shall be promoted to the next higher class. **Proficiency certificates will not be awarded to the students who miss an Examination or a part of any examination.**
- Students failing to obtain pass percentage for promotion in one subject will be promoted conditionally with an undertaking. However, students failing in two or more subjects will be detained in the same class.
- Notwithstanding the above, the Principal in consultation with the teachers may relax the provisions given above.
- A student found indulging in malpractice in any of the examinations would be awarded zero in the concerned subject.
- A student declared failed in the same class in two consecutive academic years, will be asked to withdraw from the school without any written requisition from the parent. **School Leaving Certificate will be issued to such a candidate.**
- Gross poor academic performance beyond school redressal policy may result in termination of admission.
- * **School management reserves all the rights to change any condition or rules laid down for withdrawal or termination or promotion.**

2. Exemption

• Exceptional Cases

- a. Exemption from appearing in any of the examinations may be granted only on medical ground, provided medical certificate is submitted within a week of the commencement of the examination. But in such cases, students will have to appear at least in one examination and secure 33% marks in each subject.
- b. A student of class X and XII will not be sent up if he/she does not appear in the Pre-Board examination or if he/she does not have the requisite attendance.

3. Examination Marking Criterion

For Pre-Primary learners will not have any pen and paper examinations but will be evaluated based on their day to day learning experiences and interactions with the surrounding and the objects around them

• For Std : I to IV

- a. There will be provision of four Unit Tests.
- b. The Unit Tests will be of 25 marks, out of which written test will be of 20 marks where as 5 marks will be for testing other skills which will be carried out through different activities

• For Std V to VIII

As CBSE has given freedom to decide the exam policy for classes VI to VIII, 10%, 20% & 30% syllabus of the First Term is being covered in the Annual Examination of Classes VI, VII & VIII, respectively to prepare students for the future board exams.

Scholastic Area

1. Subject Enrichment Activities (5 marks):

These are subject specific application activities aimed at enrichment of the understanding and skill development of the students. These activities are to be recorded internally by respective subject teachers.

For Languages :

- The listed practical works/ activities will be carried out as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

- Map and project work will be undertaken as prescribed by the CBSE in the curriculum.

2. Co-Scholastic Activities:

3. Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity, Behaviour, Values):

Attendance, sincerity, good behaviour, tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and values develop strength and foster unity and co-operation. Therefore, the element of discipline has been introduced. Class teacher will be responsible for grading the students on a three -point scale (A to C). The internal assessment comprising 20 marks entails objectivity and a structured approach. For a holistic assessment, the teachers are expected to make it an effective tool.

- **For Std IX to X**

- a. There will be provision of Internal Assessment and Annual Examination.
- b. As per the guideline of CBSE, weightage for Internal Assessment shall be of 20 % and Annual Assessment shall be of 80%.
- c. There will be two Pre-Board examinations for Class X.

(i) Periodic Test (5 Marks):

The school will conduct three periodic written tests in the entire academic year and average of the best two will be taken. Each periodic test will cover the portion taught be then.

The gradually increasing portion of contents would prepare students acquire confidence for appearing in the Board examination with 100% syllabus. The school will take the average of the best two tests for final marks submission.

(ii) Oral Based Test (5 Marks):

These are subject based oral and cover syllabus that are taught in class also give practice on regular bases to student.

(ii) Notebook Submission (5 Marks):
